A word from the President

« Persevere in your witness »

This encouragement, inspired by Hebrews 12:1, is the theme of the General Assembly of the World Communion of Reformed Churches (WCRC), to be held this October in Thailand. It also aptly reflects FAP's work in 2024: strengthening internal operations, deepening relationships with partners, staying alert to the root causes of suffering, and recognizing initiatives that bring life and hope across diverse contexts.

In 2024, FAP approved support for **23** projects, totaling CHF **560 608**. These include **11** training initiatives and several academic scholarships. We also took time to review and update our funding criteria, our website (now available at www.fondationfap.ch), and the principles guiding our capital management. We've also begun re-establishing in-person connections with longstanding partners, making the most of opportunities for meetings, visits, and travel—often in collaboration with the World Council of Churches

(WCC). Finally, together with staff from the WCC, ACT Alliance, and other organizations, we have moved into the «Kyoto» building in the Green Village, located just behind the WCC's historic centre. We continue to adapt to this new collaborative environment, and our secretariat would be delighted to welcome you on the first floor of our new premises.

All of this only makes sense when viewed through the lens of a long-term vision. This is the true meaning of persevering in faith and bearing witness—a calling we are privileged to fulfill through the support we offer our partners.

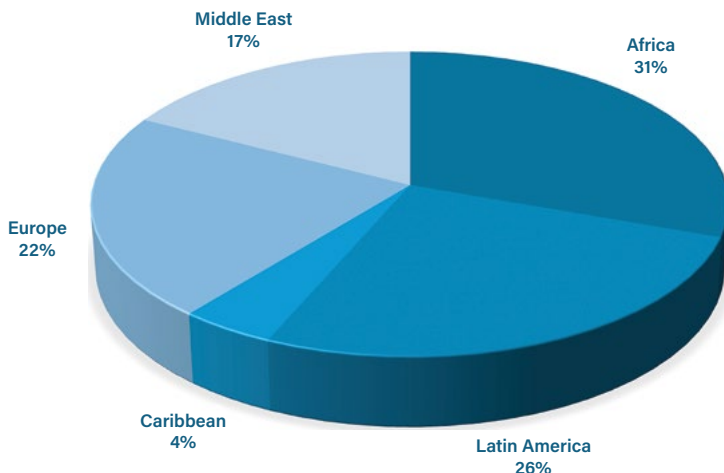

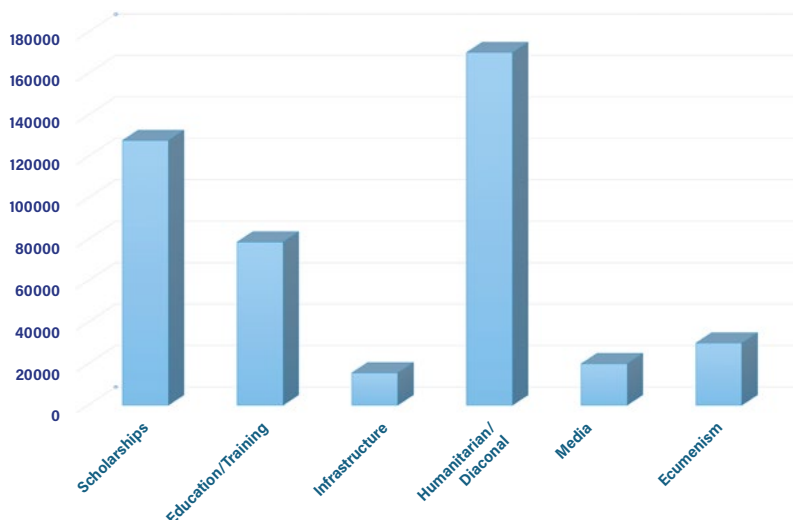

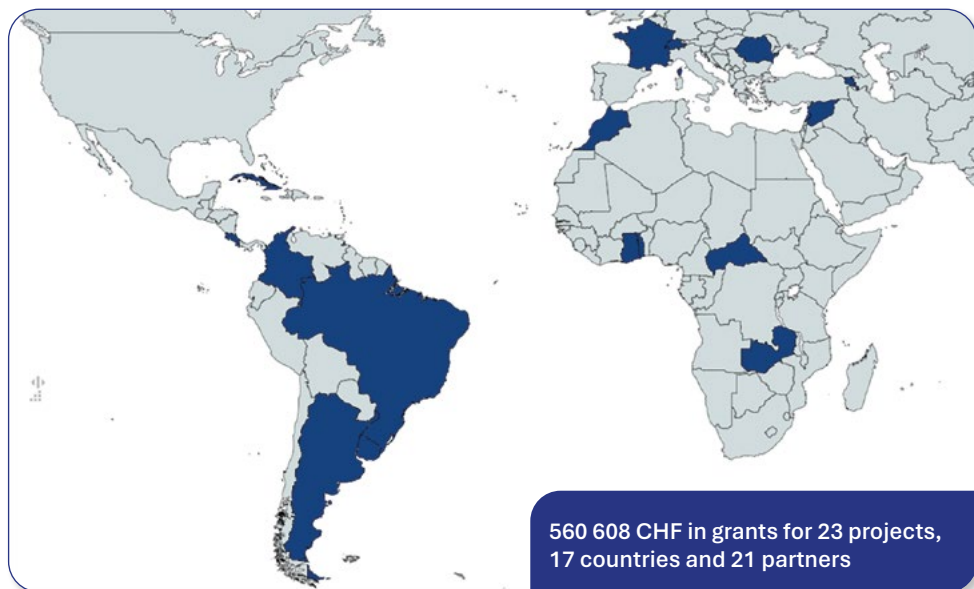

Where we work



In 2024, FAP met with international and ecumenical partners based in French-speaking Switzerland and received around ten delegations or representatives of partner churches at the secretariat. By taking part in several meetings of the international Reformed community, FAP tries to maintain living links with the churches with which it collaborates. It remains anchored in its mission in a context that sometimes changes precipitously because of economic, social or geopolitical circumstances.

SOME PROJECTS COMPLETED IN 2024

Humanitarian aid in Syria

After fifteen years of war, the situation in Syria further deteriorated in 2023 due to a devastating earthquake. Humanitarian needs among the remaining population continue to grow. The Union of Armenian Evangelical Churches in the Near East (UAECNE), a minority within the country's Christian minority, offered a sign of hope by launching a humanitarian aid programme distributing food and hygiene kits. Approximately 300 families have benefited from this initiative, which contributes to strengthening community resilience.

From Indonesia to Australia, via the Netherland

Rev. Dr. Daniel Sihombing of the Christian Church in Indonesia (GKI) pursued advanced theological studies through distance learning at the Protestant Theological University in the Netherlands, where he prepared a doctoral thesis offering a contextual reading of Karl Barth's doctrine within the Indonesian setting. After serving for several years as the leader of the Indonesian community within the Uniting Church in Australia (UCA), he is now a lecturer in systematic theology at Pilgrim Theological College in Australia.

Social work on the outskirts of Buenos Aires

The four social centres located on the outskirts of Buenos Aires operate in a context where over 40% of the population faces precarious access to housing, healthcare, and education. The programme—comprising workshops for women, community meals for the homeless, activities for adults with disabilities, and youth workshops—benefits approximately 500 individuals. By fostering self-sufficiency, the programme has a positive impact on the entire community.

Bible and intercultural training in Mexico City

More than eight hundred people—including pastors, community leaders, and volunteers—were able to participate in at least one of the seventeen weeks of training offered on a wide range of topics: supporting women who have experienced violence, families with desaparecidos, abused children, migrants, and strengthening facilitation and leadership skills. The level of interest exceeded expectations, highlighting the deep need to address the wounds of a society scarred by violence and poverty.
